In addition, Head of Counselling Services, Prof. Bhaskar Datta and Prof. Joycee Mekie, Associate Head, are also available for counselling.

IIT Gandhinagar is committed to the wellbeing of its students and ensures that they have opportunities for holistic development and free access to the Institute's counselling services. The Counselling Services consist of experienced faculty members, qualified full-time counsellors residing on campus, as well as student guides. The Counselling Services provides a variety of services to students which are aimed at fostering independent thinking and responsibility. The counselling team offers assistance to students to address academic, personal or interpersonal issues. With an aim to provide students a genuine and empathetic environment for their overall growth and well-being, the counselling services are available to all the students round the year. In addition, each student is assigned a Faculty Advisor. Further, the Student Affairs Office Staff and other resources support the counselling services and are available to students to address various requirements beyond their academic needs. Some of the main functions of the Counselling Services are as follows:  i) Counselling Sessions: Students are encouraged to meet the Institute counsellor for any assistance on emotional, interpersonal and personal problems. Sometimes, the counsellor identifies any student in need of help, and approaches him/her. In some cases, the faculty or student guide refers students to the counsellor.  ii) Viva Voce Initiative: Every student is an independent individual and we value his/her likes, dislikes, views, and concerns. Viva voce sessions aim to identify students' needs, concerns and suggestions. It is conducted once every semester for all undergraduate students for which they get a Pass/No Pass grade.  iii) Student Guides: Each year, the Counselling Services carefully selects a few students as Student Guides. They help the students from junior batches to adjust within the Institute. When a
		student enters the Institute, there are possibilities for confusion, unsolved questions and adjustment issues in the new environment. Student Guides play the role of a friend, guide and mentor to make them feel at home. They meet fellow students (initially every week then as and when required) to help them to get acquainted with the new environment. If they identify any student who needs additional help, they can refer him or her to counselling service. Generally, there are four student guide coordinators and sixteen student guides from all the student batches.
