ANNEXURE-B

Corrective steps being taken by the IIT Guwahati to minimise the dropout rate of students:

The UG students who have secured CPI less than 4.0 out 10 in two consecutive semesters shall be liable to be terminated from academic programme at IIT Guwahati. Such students need to submit reinstatement appeal to the Senate before the date of registration for the next semester. Considering the merits in the appeals, the Senate/ institute reinstate and allow them to continue in the academic programme. At IIT Guwahati, at the end of first year, the UG students normally reinstated and allowed to continue in the academic programme by extending academic help to them through Peer Assisted Learning, Special Faculty / Student Mentor, etc in the subsequent semesters. The undergraduate students are normally given multiple chances to continue in the programme and to improve their academic performances in the first three years.

At IIT Guwahati, the following remedial measures are taken to help the UG students for improving their academic performance.

Peer Assisted Learning:

- i) Senior Undergraduate Students conduct discussion and helping sessions (Doubt Clarification and Problem Solving) for the first year core courses to the first year undergraduate (BTech, BDes) student who need additional help or exhibited poor performance in-class assessments in the Hostels after dinner time.
- ii) PhD Scholars conduct special tutorial sessions (1.5 hours to 2 hours) for the first year core courses to the to the first year undergraduate (BTech, BDes) student who need additional help or exhibited poor performance inclass assessments on Saturdays and Sundays.

• Special Faculty Mentor/ Student Mentor:

Apart from the faculty advisor, special faculty mentor or a specific student Mentor is assigned by the Head of the Department to help the academically weaker students and continuously monitor their academic performance.

• Summer Term Courses:

At IIT Guwahati, certain courses are exclusively offered during Summer Term to help the students who have failed during regular semester to do and pass the courses.

Supplementary Examinations:

At IIT Guwahati, supplementary examinations are conducted for the courses of BTech, BDes, MSc, MA Programmes to the students who failed in the courses (other than seminar and project based courses) due to poor academic performances in the immediately preceding semester.

Report on IIT Council's resolution related to "Measures for promoting wellness in the Campus" Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati

Following the report of the Task Force for prevention of suicide and promotion of wellness in the Central Government Funded Institutions (CFTIs), various preventive measures have been further adopted in the Institute for strengthening the mental health as well as all-round development and wellbeing of students.

The Counselling Cell (started in January 2010) which is treated as Wellness Centre in the Institute has been functioning under the Students' Affairs Section. Chairman, Students' Welfare Board (SWB), who is a senior faculty member, oversees the smooth and effective functioning of the Counselling Cell. The Counselling Cell has four full-time counsellors at present. It is supported by SAATHI, a student run club under Students' Welfare Board. The Cell and the Medical Section are active collaborators in the management of distressed community members round the clock.

The primary objective es of the Cell are, to promote wellbeing and good mental health, to support students in coping with their varied stressful issues, to help students learn management of stress, time, lifestyle, and self, to provide a safe, welcoming and non-judgmental space to express concerns, to facilitate personal, academic and professional progression, to act as an effective agent in realizing the maximum potential of the Institute's human resource, to serve the IITG community in their pursuit of health and happiness.

The Counselling Cell is operational on all working days. All the Counsellors and the SAATHI team members are available even beyond working hours and can be reached by phone, SMS and/or email.

The major activities of the Cell, to grow as a Wellness Centre, are: to provide Individual/Group/Family Counselling, to do psychometric assessments, to help a fresher to adjust well into the campus life, to conducts Open House Sessions, to organize Life Skills Workshops, to facilitate in - house Training Programmes, and to collaborate with SAATHI in organisation of useful events.

Besides the above, a brief report highlighting the points mentioned in the 51st IIT Council Meeting, the major steps taken by the Institute in this regard, are as provided below.

a) Multi-modal Vulnerability Assessment for Early Identification

For promoting wellness in the early days of campus life of a student, involving various Institute Authorities, Students' Counsellors, faculty, staff and student members, some of the initiatives undertaken by the Institute are:

- A Orientation programme is conducted by various levels of Institute functionaries immediately after registration. In addition, interaction programmes with Students' Counsellors involving both students and parents are also conducted immediately.
- Ice breaking Sessions for the fresher are conducted as part of the initiation programme in each hostel. Counsellors engage in various interactive activities with the fresher as well as Hostel Management Committee members to help them assimilate into the hostel and campus life in a smooth manner.
- Mandatory Interaction with all the registered First Semester BTech/BDes students are conducted by the Counsellors on one to one basis for early detection of vulnerability. Follow up sessions are also being conducted as per requirement, sometimes involving parents too as the case may be.
- Peer Mentorship Programme (student to student) has been put into place with the active involvement of the SAATHI club members.
- Various sessions on Life skills are conducted on Self-image, Self-awareness, Relationships and Communication, Time Management, Stress Management, Professional Soft skills, Decision Making and Problem Solving.
- Psychometric assessments of the students are also done by the Counselling Cell of the Institute.

b) Wider Mental Health Assessment Programme

Following arrangements are in practice at the Institute

• Students' Welfare Board (SWB) under Students' Affairs Section of the Institute is committed to the overall and holistic development of the students of IIT-Guwahati. The Welfare Service forms part of Campus Well-being Services and is committed to providing free professional and confidential support to enhance the well-being of the campus community. Based on the founding principles of the Institute, SWB through its different clubs implements programs and activities designed to nurture and develop the mind, body, and spirit, for preserving and creating awareness about human rights of campus residents, including issues of ragging, harassment, and any sort of discrimination.



- Apart from the Counselling Cell with four full time Counsellors, one visiting Psychiatrist is in place for constant support of the mental health related issues of the students.
- Depending on the degree of intensity of situations and problems, parents and family members are alerted and discussed with to make appropriate decisions that help and guide students in crisis.
- Open House Sessions are being conducted for students in regular intervals.
- Interaction Club under the SWB conducts regular events aimed at increasing compassionate interaction between the faculty and students beyond the classroom. Besides, every department has a club to cater to this need. The living and learning nature of the campus provides sufficiently for such opportunities.
- There are sufficient avenues that the student is educated of about expressing his/her grievance which comes to the notice of the Institute Authority.
- A Campus Wellbeing Group (with voluntary involvement of keen faculty/staff members) to look after overall quality of life of students.
- A Substance Abuse Prevention and Remediation Committee is in place to constantly look after activities related to Substance Abuse.
- Constant monitoring of academic activities of students by the faculty members.
- Conduction of motivational lectures and interaction sessions by In-house as well as outside experts.
- Conduction of mental health related workshops, such as, YES+ workshops, Art of Living workshops, Yoga workshops etc. in regular intervals.
- Some of recreation facilities in place are: well-equipped sports, gym facilities, Students' Activity Center, Students' Food Court, Auditorium, Mini Auditorium, Community Hall, Open Stage for organizing various events and cultural programs.
- Organization of various recreational events by five different boards, Students'
 Welfare Board, Cultural Board, Sports Board, Technical Board and Hostel
 Affairs Board, e.g., Alcheringa, Techniche, Udgam, Advaya, Tech Evince, Kriti,
 Manthan, Spardha, Inter IIT Sports Meet etc., time to time screening of
 movies.
- Students can also engage themselves in various activities of their choice through different clubs earmarked for different activities.
- In addition, there are Students' Activity Courses (non-credit) of their choice in the areas of Sports & Games, NCC, Community Service (CoS), Performing Arts.

- In addition, though Yoga is a part of Students' Activity Course (non-credit), the expertise of the Yoga instructors are also made available for the benefit of other students and whole IIT Guwahati community.
- Observance of significant days like World Mental Health Day, Suicide Prevention Day, Yoga Day with active involvement and participation of the student community.

c) Help Manual, Attendance Management, Alert and QRTs

- Freshers Help Desk in different places as per requirement are installed during registration of new students.
- A Freshers' Guide book is provided to the new students during registration.
- All requisite information is made available in Institute website.
- Preparation of awareness posters related to ragging, mental hygiene, positive mind etc. are being installed in certain designated places of the Institute time to time.
- Proper signage is in place for any guidance inside campus.
- Institute maintains biometric attendance of the students.
- 24 hours emergency medical and security helpline numbers are in place for any kind of emergency.
- During exigencies of students, relevant officials extends their support irrespective of their duty hours on being alerted.

IIT Guwahati has always put foremost importance on the overall growth and personality development of its students with sound mental and physical health along with intellectual and professional growth. The Institute will continue to make sound investment on these vital aspects to create the best manpower for the country.

Reasons for very low rate of conversion of patents to commercial production




Fig. 1 Quantification of innovation process

The quantification of innovation process is explained in Fig. 1.

 The technology readiness level (TRL) as denoted in Fig. 1 is an excellent method to keep track of innovation and technology development.



- The move from TRL 4 to TRL 6 is highly resource intense, and is famously called valley of death (VoD).
- Most of the good ideas, about 90%, perish while crossing the VoD due to various reasons in which the lack of funding is the primary reason.
- Most of the researchers in academic institutions file patents at end of TRL 4.
- This is a premature stage to file a patent because one is not certain if the idea will successfully cross VoD, which is essential for commercialization.
- An ideal time for filing the patents or any IPR is at the end of TRL6.
- Any IPR filed at the end of TRL 6 will have a higher chance of getting commercialized.
- Work upto TRL3 is basic research and it should be published in journals and presented in conferences.
- Work from TRL4 to TRL6 is actual technology development and at this stage patents should be filed.

Reasons for poor commercialization

- i. Lack of proper guidance and advice.
- ii. The funded research projects are usually for 3 years, which is not enough to work from TRL1 to TRL5/6.
- iii. Time and cost involved in writing a good patent application is high. This puts pressure on the researchers to file patents that are not properly matured, and hence may not be successfully commercialized.
- iv. The reason above leads to the non-availability of industrial partners to further pursue commercialization.

Potential solutions

The following affirmative steps can be taken to increase the percentage of patents that can be commercialized:

- A robust IPR divisions in the institutes with adequate funding to hire services of patent attorneys, who can help in providing guidance and successful filing of patents.
- ii. Extensive awareness programmes for researchers on IPR.
- iii. Special funds for patent filing and further processing if it is not covered under a funded project.
- iv. Frequent industry-academia interactions to enable exchange of ideas and encourage people to work on themes that have commercial implications right at the conceptual state.
- v. Frame proper guidelines about the ownership of IPR and also devise mechanisms to financially reward teams that succeed in commercialization of IPR.
